

## 2017 M-Step Scores

In the spring of 2017, approximately 767,600 students across the state of Michigan participated in a newer style of state assessment called the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (or more affectionately known as the M-STEP). The M-STEP has now replaced the previous state assessment known as the MEAP. Over 82% of student participants (including St. Matthew Lutheran) also completed the M-STEP assessment online.

Educators utilize various forms of assessment to determine the progress of their students. The M-STEP is one of numerous tests that St. Matthew selects to utilize in grades 7 and 8. We feel that participating in the State assessments provides us with valuable insight in regardto student achievement and how our students compare to surrounding districts and state norms. As we strive to give our students and our Lord our best, we also use this information as we continuously enhance our curriculum and instructional methodologies.
